

# From the Good News Committee...

(The following is a continuation from our last newsletter.)

Below is a partial list of ways that congregations and, more specifically, you as a member of First Presbyterian Church can love any and all who walk through our doors. This list is adapted from the book Now Go Forward by J. David Eschelman, who says, "Loving unbelievers the way Jesus did is the most overlooked key to growing a church . . . The command to love is the most repeated command in the New Testament, appearing at least 55 times."

- 8. Use only appropriate and allowed *touch*, such as a handshake or a gentle pat on the back.
- 9. Ask *questions* and learn about *your guests*. It is better to express interest in them than it is to try to "sell" your church.
- 10. *Listening* is a very effective way to show love.
- 11. Greet children at *their level*.
- 12. Let children be *children*. Yes, families love children's church and child care. We also love it when you allow us to decide if our children should remain with us in worship and, even more, when you love our kids as kids (crying, playing, singing) and don't expect them to be grown-ups.
- 13. Invite visitors to join you at *something, anything*! Invite them to today's fellowship meal, next Sunday's Christian Education hour, or to a restaurant for some one-on-one time.
- 14. Never let new people *sit alone.* Eschelman says, "New people should **never** have to sit alone. Take initiative and go to them without delay."



# A Tithe of Days

**Lent:** the 40 days, not counting Sundays, from Ash Wednesday until Easter, observed by Christians as a season of fasting and penitence.





Two words spelled and pronounced the same; the only difference is that one has a capital letter. Christians get the name of their special season from the old Anglo-Saxon word for "lengthen," because Lent comes at the time when the days begin to lengthen. However, Robert Bolt has pointed out the significance of the name, matching the past tense of our English word for "lend." Bolt asks some significant questions:

"Want to thank God for a life that has been lent to you? Maybe that is what it means to say we are "living on borrowed time." How better than to spend 40 days expressing our gratitude for life in service to those who may not feel the same gratitude, because their borrowed life does not look or feel so wonderful? Want to thank God for the material riches that you enjoy? What better way than to consider the 40 days of Lent as a time to try out tithing? If all that we have is a gift from God in the first place, does that mean that it has only been lent to us to put at another's service or use?"

The Christian's season of Lent has been described as the "spiritual tithing of the year." Forty days—a tithe of the year. As we journey through Lent and the days begin to lengthen, may we give from our lives and our riches with gratitude for all that God has *lent* us. In the opportunities listed in this newsletter, may you find ways to tithe your life in Lent.

# Wednesday Night Meals Policy Change

- There is no longer a permanent list for Wednesday night meals. Each individual/family must sign up weekly on the friendship pad, via the church website, or by calling the church office at 437-1811 by 10:00 AM each Monday to reserve a meal(s). Reservations may be left on the church answering machine.
- If a child wants the publicized adult meal, they must pay the adult meal price of \$7.
- If you reserve a meal(s) for a Wednesday night, we ask that you pay for your meal(s), whether or not you attend, as the church must pay for those meals.
- Folks without reservations will be asked to wait until 5:40 PM to go through the line, to make sure there is enough food for folks that have reservations.
- We will call for second helpings at 6:00 PM, if they are available. However, each reservation is guaranteed only one adult or child meal.
- We ask that all set-up and serving volunteers arrive at 4:30 PM to help get ready for Wednesday night.
- All individuals and volunteers are required to pay for their meals on Wednesday nights.
